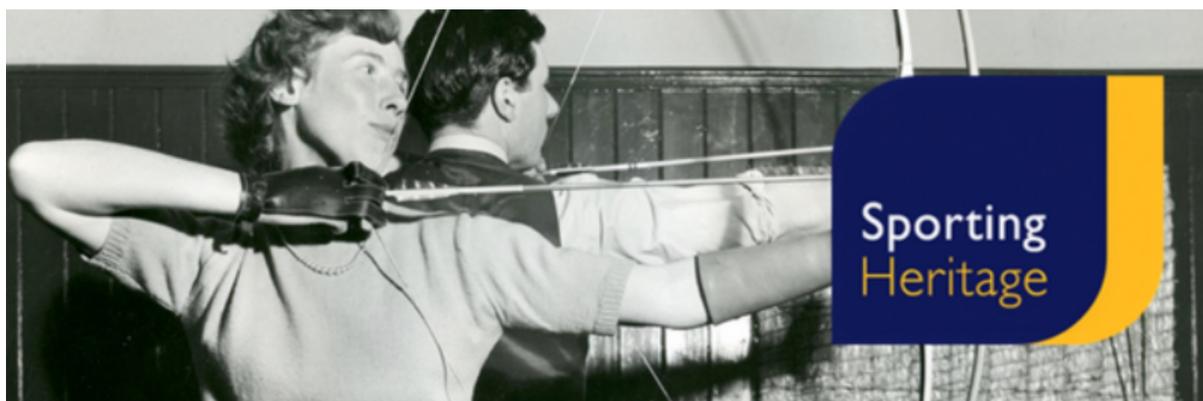

the day and Michael White who developed the Football Reminiscence Project with the Scottish Football Museum and Alzheimer Scotland will round off the day. You can also hear about the research behind the projects from Professor Richard Haynes, University of Stirling and why they are funded by charities such as, Life Changes Trust.

Organised by CAHG and SCA (Scottish Archives Council). The Community Archives and Heritage Groups (CAHG) Scotland network is part of a two-years pilot programme of regional groups which form part of the ARA UK and Ireland specialist group, CAHG. The main aim of the group is to promote sharing and exchange of skills and knowledge between professionals and volunteers based in Scotland.

The event is part of the [Being Human Festival](#), the UK's only national festival of the humanities. In November, each year the festival brings together universities, museums, galleries, archives, independent research organisations, community and commercial partners to make research in the humanities accessible to non-specialist audiences and demonstrate its relevance to our everyday lives. Every year the festival features around 300 events across the country, working with an average of around 80 universities and research organisations in 50 towns and cities each year.

Ongoing Grants

- **Pilgrim Trust - UK**

Grants for social welfare projects and for preservation and scholarship relating to historic and archaeological records and places of worship. The average grant size is £18,000.

- **Dulverton Trust**

The Dulverton Trust operate within the following main areas of activity: Youth and Education, General Welfare, Conservation, Preservation, Peace and Humanitarian Support, Africa. The Trustees meet three times a year to consider grant proposals: in February, June and October. The selection process can take between three and six months so it is advisable to apply in plenty of time, especially if funding is required by a certain date.
