

Education Momentum Builds New Website Pages Now Live!

Designed as a 'one stop shop', the fully updated site contains our consistently updated and growing range of freely downloadable resources and teacher guides, information on the Schools Sporting Heritage Day Competition, blogs and links to related webinars and newsletter items.



By the start of the new academic year in September it is intended that the suite of resources will have grown to include:

This expanding range of learning resources, in many cases designed for flexible use across different age ranges and curriculum areas, is of course a core part of new Education strategy featured in our March edition of the Newsletter. It's been an enormous pleasure and privilege to work with brilliantly creative colleagues at the Berkshire Cricket Foundation, MCC and World Rugby Museum at Twickenham on the Women's Cricket and Rugby resources respectively - and author David Gleave on the first Viv Anderson-themed resource for 'Football's Black Pioneers', inspired by his wonderful book of the same name. Thank you!

Also on the theme of new partnerships, this month has seen an exciting and greatly valued collaboration with The Historical Association, with resources shared on the website and a webinar for members on our work held on 5 July.

Dulverton Trust

The Dulverton Trust operate within the following main areas of activity:

- **Youth Opportunities:** aims to support charities that help disadvantaged children and young people to adopt a more positive attitude to their lives, raise their aspirations and realise their full potential.
- **General Welfare:** supporting a wide range of activities that benefit disadvantaged people and communities
- **Conservation**

Applications can be submitted at any time. Grant proposals are considered three times a year: in February, June and October.

English Heritage Repair Grants for Heritage at Risk

Grants are available towards the repair and conservation of listed buildings, scheduled monuments and registered parks and gardens. This includes project development actions which enable repair or improved future management. Grants under this scheme are intended to reduce the risk faced by some of the most significant historic sites in England, as shown on the Heritage at Risk Register. Grants focus on those sites which are most in need of repair and where without this grant, a project would not be able to go ahead.

This scheme was formerly called Grants for Historic Buildings, Monuments and Designed Landscapes.

Tokyo 1967: Designing Tomorrow Japan House, London (5 Aug - 7 Nov)

Tokyo 1964: Designing Tomorrow explores the pioneering design strategy and lasting legacy of the historic Tokyo 1964 Olympic Games, the first to be held in Asia, which are often seen as a turning point for Japan.



This exhibition shows how a group of young Japanese designers and architects harnessed the opportunity presented by the 1964 Olympic Games to reframe the country's profile and tell a fresh story to the world. Their ground-breaking designs are important as they have informed the design principles of all subsequent major international sporting events.

Many of the exhibits are on loan outside Japan for the first time.
