Partner Updates

150 Years of the Exeter Chiefs

During 2022, Devon Archives and Local Studies Service collaborated with the Royal Albert Memorial Museum and the club on an exhibition to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the foundation, in October 1872, of Exeter Rugby Club, who, as the Exeter Chiefs, have risen through the ranks of professional rugby union in the UK and Europe in recent years.



The archives were augmented by objects normally on display at Sandy Park, including

many shirts worn by players in important matches, team photographs, and all the club's major trophies. Other items were loaned by supporters and former players, and a small number of exhibits were drawn from the existing Heritage Centre collections.



The exhibition was extremely successful, attracting in the region of 10,000 visitors during the month it was on.

Archive Volunteering Award 2023
